WHAT IS CALFOOD?

The CalFood Program allocates state funding to food banks for purchasing, storing, and distributing food grown and/or produced in California.


KEY ADVANTAGES OF THE CALFOOD PROGRAM

- Food banks can meet diverse dietary/cultural needs and purchase rarely-donated items like eggs and meat.
- Food banks leverage economies of scale each dollar enables food banks to provide about five meals.
- Fights hunger while supporting the farmers and food producers critical to California's food economy.

WHY CALFOOD MATTERS

The CalFood Program is facing a ~\$54 million drop in average annual funding at the end of June 2025. Meanwhile, food insecurity in California is rising, with 22% of all households, and 27% of households with children experiencing hunger as of September 2024.* Our request of \$60 million ongoing funding is critical for food banks to be able to address the continuing and mounting hunger cliff.

TOTAL CALFOOD FUNDING PER FISCAL YEAR, 2022–2026



CalFood has been funded with an annual \$8M baseline, with additional multi-year funding (\$112M in 2022-23, \$52M in 2023-24), for a total of \$62.7M on average per year between July 2022 and June 2025. It reverts to \$8M baseline after this fiscal year. We're requesting a permanent increase of \$52M to the baseline, starting in 2025–26 (for a total of \$60M annually).
